Over \$3 million granted to expand and accelerate research

Gastric Cancer Registry

Providing a powerful tool for researchers around the globe
The Foundation launched the first HIPAA-compliant registry in
2011 to create a bridge between patients and the researchers
who are seeking greater understanding and more effective
methods of prevention, diagnosis and treatment. Tumor
and saliva samples undergo whole genome sequencing and
sophisticated analyses. The new Genome Explorer web
portal – a comprehensive database of clinical and genomic
information about gastric cancer – is available (free of charge)
to researchers around the globe.

Research Scholar Awards

Keeping brilliant scientists focused on stomach cancer
Scarce funding for gastric cancer research discourages
early-career investigators from focusing on this cancer
type. The Research Scholar Award created in partnership
with the American Gastroenterological Association provides
outstanding scholars with three-year grants of \$100,000 per
year to launch gastric cancer studies and build portfolios of
work that make them competitive in seeking larger grants.









Early-Stage Research Grants

Seed funding for projects with the potential to bring new treatments to patients

The Foundation places special focus on seed grants that enable researchers to generate sufficient preliminary data to submit compelling and competitive applications for larger grants. This type of funding is often the most difficult for researchers to obtain. The Foundation funds projects at centers of research excellence across the country.

Published Research

Sharing discoveries through published papers

More than a dozen papers reporting findings from Foundationfunded research studies have been accepted and published in acclaimed journals. The growing library of published papers is available at gastriccancer.org.
